NICE GUIDANCE PH48 TOOLKIT DOCUMENT 12: SMOKEFREE NHS TRAINING PLAN

Smoking remains the leading cause of ill health and mortality in England. The NHS must prioritise efforts to reduce smoking rates. This document is intended to assist Trusts to develop an effective local training plan, to support their Smokefree work. Within the table below are training elements which are strongly recommended to be delivered as mandatory. By focussing action in this way, achieving the culture change needed to make a Smokefree NHS a reality can be realised.

The National Centre for Smoking Cessation Training (NCSCT) has a range of evidence-based, accredited training packages to support delivery of effective interventions around smoking. They were developed primarily for use by health professionals in Primary Care Settings, though their content, particularly Very Brief Advice (VBA,) is an extremely valuable resource for all who come into contact with people who smoke.

Health Education England (HEE) have developed further training resources using the same evidence-base to provide Level 1 and 2 packages for Secondary Care Settings. These have been designed to help Trusts achieve national CQUIN targets for Preventing III Health Through Risky Behaviours addressing VBA for both alcohol and smoking.
